Dear Lexington Resident: Sept. 2011

The current curbside collection contract with JRM will expire at the end of June 2012. In May 2011 the Board of Selectmen appointed a six member Trash & Recycling Collection Task Force. The purpose of the Task Force is to provide input on the following policy issues:

- 1) Single-stream recycling (i.e. collecting paper and containers combined)
- 2) Multi-town (regional) collection bid
- 3) Automated refuse & recycling collection system using totes/wheeled carts
- 4) Additional curbside yard waste collections
- 5) Enhanced waste ban and mandatory recycling enforcement
- 6) Staying with current refuse and recycling collection system and vendor

The Task Force has been meeting regularly throughout the summer to meet with haulers, processors and other towns to examine the feasibility and utility and to make recommendation on the above policy issues and thereby provide guidance to the Board of Selectmen and DPW staff in developing bid documents. The Task Force will make their recommendation to town officials this fall.

Lexington Rubbish Guidelines

HOUSEHOLD TRASH INSTRUCTIONS

- ◆ Place trash barrels or bags at curb no later than 7 A.M. on your collection day and remove within 12 hours of collection.
- ◆ For general trash questions call LEX DPW at 781-274-8300 and press 1.
- ◆ For missed pick-up call JRM at 1-800-323-4285.
- ◆ JRM will collect up to 6 bags or barrels (32 gal. limit) of trash and 1 bulky item per week. Bulky items are mostly furniture like a mattress & box spring, sofa, chair, auto tire (w/o rim) carpet (no more than 15 rolls at a time, cut in 4' lengths, rolled & tied) other furniture and large toys. Also accepted unpainted wood cut in 3 foot lengths, tied & bundled (not more than 50 lbs per bundle).
- ◆ Additional trash can be put out when moving in or out. Trash **MUST** be in bags or barrels at the curb in an orderly manner (**NOT** loose in piles) or it will not be collected.
- ◆ Call a private hauler for:
 - Construction & demolition debris eg. plywood, lumber, bathtubs, cabinets, sheetrock & windows (contractors/homeowner responsible for disposal) See Building Materials Resource Center website for alternatives www.bostonbmr.org
 - Tree stumps, rocks, dirt & sand.
 - Automotive parts
 - Property cleanouts

COMPUTERS, TV'S, & ELECTRONICS

- ◆ TV's, computers and other miscellaneous electronics (incl. keyboards, mouse, printer, vcr's, stereos, etc.) can be collected curbside separate from Household Trash, by appointment
- ◆ Resident **must call** JRM at 1-800-323-4285 to schedule curbside collection on the same day as your weekly trash/recycle collection day.
- ◆ Resident must schedule appointment by 3 P.M. the day prior to one's regular collection day.
- ◆ Residents are limited to putting out not more than ten CRT related items per year.

HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTS: (HHP)

- ◆ Bring household cleaners, oil, gasoline and other automotive products, lawn & garden chemicals, oil-based paint & stains, varnishes & wood preservatives and other products such as fluorescent bulbs, propane tanks and auto batteries to the:
Minuteman HHP Regional Facility, 60 Hartwell Avenue
- ◆ 2011 remaining HHP collections: Sunday Sept. 18, Saturday October 15, and Saturday November 5, from 9:00 A.M. - 2:00 P.M.
- ◆ 2012 HHP collections: Saturday April 21, Saturday May 19, Saturday June 16, Saturday July 21, Saturday August 18, Sunday Sept. 16, Saturday October 20, and Saturday November 10, from 9:00 A.M. - 2:00 P.M.

- ◆ Don't bring water-base latex paint to HHP collections. Open cans to air, mix with kitty litter, shredded paper or use paint hardener (available at hardware store) to dry out, when paint in can is solidified put out in trash bag.

HHP SAFETY TIPS:

- ◆ Sort and pack paint, pesticides and cleaners separately. Pack your car and go directly to the collection site. Never smoke while handling items; tighten caps and lids; never mix chemicals and use original labeled containers. Always keep children and pets away from toxic items.

UNIVERSAL WASTE SHED FOR DROP OFF OF MERCURY ITEMS:

- ◆ Lexington Residents (proof of residency required) can drop off thermostats, thermometers, fluorescent bulbs, compact fluorescent bulbs, button cell batteries, and nickel cadmium rechargeable batteries at the Universal Waste shed at Hartwell Avenue during regular operating hours. No other hazardous wastes accepted at shed. These mercury items can also be brought to any of the 8 HHP collections (for collection dates see HHP section above).

APPLIANCES & LARGE METAL ITEMS:

- ◆ Resident must call JRM at 1-800-323-4285 to schedule curbside collection of an appliance or large metal items which will be collected on the same day as your weekly trash day. Resident must schedule appointment by 3 P.M. the day prior to your regular trash collection day.
- ◆ Resident must have scheduled appliance out to the curb by 7 A.M. for pick-up. Doors on freezer or refrigerator must be removed.
- ◆ Stoves, microwaves, clothes washers and dryers, refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, water heaters and dehumidifiers are required by law to be handled separately from household trash.
- ◆ Large scrap metal items such as a desk, bike, cabinet, barbeque grill (w/o propane tank), wood stove or metal box spring etc. can be scheduled for curbside collection like an appliance. Please note that lawnmowers and snow blowers can also be picked-up but these items must be completely drained of oil and gas.

SCRAP METAL DROP OFF:

- ◆ Residents are encouraged to use the scrap metal drop off container located at Hartwell Avenue. Acceptable scrap metal items include antennas, bed frames, bikes, curtain rods, fans, file cabinets, grills, (charcoal and gas-remove tank), gutters, downspouts, ladders, railings, pots and pans, screen doors, metal shelving, signs, sinks, swing sets, toasters and wheelbarrows, during regular operating hours and on the weekends.

MEDICAL WASTE DISPOSAL DAYS:

- ◆ Wednesday Oct. 5, 2011, 5 - 7 P.M., Saturday Oct. 29, 2011, 9:00 A.M. - 12 Noon, Saturday April 7, 2012, 9:00 A.M. - 12 Noon, and Wednesday June 6, 2012, 5 - 7 P.M. behind Town Hall, 1625 Mass. Ave. in the parking lot behind the building.
- ◆ What to Bring:
 - Sharps, needles, syringes stored in capped sturdy containers, such as sharp containers, detergent bottle, coffee can or similar non-returnable sturdy containers.
 - Expired medicine
- ◆ Lexington Residents Only (ID/License required)

Lexington Recycling Guidelines

“Recycle Every Week in Lexington”

why recycle?

Recycling saves money, creates jobs and reduces climate change. For every ton we recycle, we save 17 trees, 2 barrels of oil, 7000 gallons of water and over 3000 pounds of air pollutants. In FY11 trash was reduced by nearly 442 tons or nearly 5%. Recycling tons of paper, cardboard and plastic, glass and metal containers was down by nearly 3% or 128 tons. Revenues generated at the Lexington Compost Facility from the sale of compost products and contractor yard waste permits totaled \$414,000 in FY11.

important recycling instructions

- ◆ Recycling is MANDATORY in Lexington.
- ◆ If recyclables appear in trash, JRM will sticker item and leave it behind.
- ◆ Place recyclables at curb at least 8' away from trash.
- ◆ Place recycle bins out by 7 A.M. on your collection day.
- ◆ Remove empty recycle bins within 12 hours of collection.
- ◆ New and replacement recycling bins are available at the new Lexington Public Services Facility, 201 Bedford Street. Each household is entitled to 2 recycle bins at no charge. Additional bins cost \$6 each. To recycle broken recycle bins return them to 201 Bedford Street Compost bins (\$30) and rain barrels (\$75 until supplies last) can be purchased at 201 Bedford Street, Monday – Friday, 7:00 A.M. – 3:30 P.M. and picked-up at the Lexington Compost facility at Hartwell Avenue, Monday – Friday, 7:00 A.M. – 3:00 P.M.
- ◆ Don't Throw it Away! If you want to find a new home for something, whether it's a toy, chair, piano or just about anything else simply send an e-mail offering it to members of the Freecycle group in your area. Go to www.freecycle.org for details.

Lexington Compost Facility

Leaves, grass, yard waste including brush/branches ONLY 1" – 4" in diameter. Drop-off: Lexington Compost Facility, 60 Hartwell Ave. opens mid March – mid Dec. weather permitting, weekdays M-F 7:30 A.M. – 3:00 P.M. and Sundays 8:00 A.M. – 4:00 P.M. Expanded hours for 10 weeks in the fall and spring. Starting Monday Sept. 26 - Saturday Dec. 3, 2011 weekdays 7:30 A.M. to 4:30 P.M., weekends Sat & Sun. open 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. Spring expanded hours starting Monday March 26 - Saturday June 2, 2012 weekdays 7:30 A.M. to 4:30 P.M., weekends Sat & Sun. open 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. except on HHP collections when facility is open ONLY until 2 P.M.

For additional drop-off recycling services at Hartwell Ave. (see other side of flyer)

paper & cardboard:

Lexington operates a two-sort program: paper must be separated from commingled containers. Mixed paper in a paper bag can be placed on top of recycle bin with commingled containers. Keep paper free of food and plastic wrapping and NO PLASTIC BAGS.



what to recycle:

- ◆ Newspapers/inserts
 - ◆ Magazines, phone books and catalogs
 - ◆ Junk mail/office paper
 - ◆ Clean pizza boxes (folded inside out)
 - ◆ Paperboard (cereal and shoe boxes etc.) and paperback books
 - ◆ Corrugated cardboard
- Curbside collection: cardboard must be flattened and cut to 36" x 36" or less, and for multiple pieces it must be tied/bundled together, or placed under or between recycle bins. Cardboard placed in trash barrel/bags will be stickered and all contents left at the curb. **Drop-off option:** bring flattened oversized cardboard to container at Lexington Compost facility mid March - mid December. See yard waste drop-off for hours.

no need to remove...

...staples, paper clips, metal spirals, or plastic windows on envelopes.

glass, metal & plastic containers:

Place rinsed containers loose in your bin, no plastic or paper bags. OK to include plastic & metal caps & lids.



recycle more containers:

- ◆ Residents can use any 32 gallon barrel for recycling glass, metal & plastic containers. Face the sticker (available at 201 Bedford St., 1st floor DPW office) to the street when using a barrel. (No more than 35 lbs. per barrel)
- ◆ Clear, green and brown glass food and beverage containers only
- ◆ Deposit and non-deposit beverage cans
- ◆ Metal food cans, lids and caps
- ◆ Aluminum pie plates and trays
- ◆ Aseptic containers such as: milk and juice cartons, and juice/drink boxes
- ◆ All thru plastic containers ONLY (look for symbol on bottom of containers)
- ◆ Stiff plastic Styrofoam food trays

leaf & yard waste:

Yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected.

See shaded area in the recycling calendar for weeks when yard waste will be collected at the curb.



what is yard waste?

- ◆ Leaves, grass clippings, dead flower plants, wood chips, pine needles, organic vegetation, brush 1 inch in diameter or less

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING Special curbside recycling collection weeks of Jan. 3 - 7 and Jan. 9 - 13, 2012 on regular collection day. Trees are picked up in a separate truck. Resident must remove all foreign objects (plastic bags, ornaments, tinsel, lights, etc.) Place tree curbside separate from trash & recyclables. An alternative is to drop off tree at the Lexington Compost Facility at Hartwell Avenue from 12/27/11 - 1/31/12 **ALL FOREIGN OBJECTS MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE TREE. Please note: Christmas trees are no longer accepted at the Samuel Hadley Public Services Building on 201 Bedford Street.**

how to prepare paper:

- ◆ Place mixed paper in brown paper bags on top of recycle bin with containers or place all mixed paper together in recycle bin separate from recycle bin with commingled containers.
- ◆ Paperboard (e.g. cereal & cracker boxes) flattened, foil & plastic liners removed
- ◆ Call Friends of Cary Library 781-862-6288 to donate books or Got Books at 978-327-7600
- ◆ Shredded paper must be put in a paper bag and stapled closed and placed in or on top of bin
- ◆ Do not recycle soiled pizza boxes, put in trash

cardboard dropoff sites:

Residents with lots of cardboard or oversized boxes can bring it to the Lexington Compost Facility at Hartwell Ave. (for hours see below), or directly behind the White House (in Town Hall parking lot) or at the Grace Chapel parking lot off of Worthen Road. Look for "cardboard only" green slotted JRM containers. Boxes must be flattened. No soiled or waxed cardboard.

how to prepare containers:

- ◆ RINSE CLEAN ALL CONTAINERS
- ◆ Collars, neck rings & labels ok
- ◆ Crush plastic & aseptic containers
- ◆ RINSE CLEAN and include with other containers
- ◆ Remove straws from juice/drink boxes

do not include:

- ◆ NO plastic bags-recycle at area grocery stores
- ◆ Plastic motor oil or chemical containers
- ◆ All stiff Styrofoam packaging should be put in trash
- ◆ Corks and broken glass
- ◆ Ceramics, window glass, mirrors, light bulbs, drinking glasses and unclean flowerpots
- ◆ Aluminum foil, paint cans, metal items, aerosol cans, coat hangers
- ◆ To recycle large metal items, see reverse side.

how to prepare yard waste:

- ◆ Place yard waste in paper biodegradable bags or open barrels without lids & place at curbside separate from trash & recycling
- ◆ ORANGE yard waste stickers for barrels available at DPW

do not include:

- ◆ NO PLASTIC BAGS
- ◆ No stumps or logs
- ◆ No rocks, stones, dirt or sand
- ◆ No construction waste
- ◆ No Brush larger than 1" in diameter
