


Cranberry Hill

25 acres, 0.1 miles of trail connecting to trails on the neighboring utility power line property, Hobb's Brook Basin, and into Lincoln. The Cranberry Hill area contains a rich forest, hilly terrain associated with the Bloody Bluff Fault, Hobb's Brook, and 2 certified vernal pools where frogs and salamanders congregate to mate in the spring.

Access is from the back of Parking Area C at the Cranberry Hill Office Complex off of Massachusetts Avenue, where parking is permitted. A pedestrian easement allows access across the power line area. Please note that the Lexington Conservation Division is only responsible for trails shown in solid yellow; dotted yellow trails cross other properties.
