
North Street

24 acres, 0.2 miles of trail (plus 1 mile recreation path). North Street, a former sand pit, features a large pond that provides a home for turtles, fish, frogs, and water birds, including frequent visits by great blue herons. A recreation path parallels Vine Brook from North Street to Emerson Road, eventually connecting with Lower Vine Brook conservation area. North Street is one of Lexington's newer conservation areas, and a trail system here is still under development.

Access is from North Street or Emerson Road via the recreation path. Limited parking is available in a paved lot at the southwestern corner of the Adams Street intersection with North Street.
