

## Chronology of the Senior Center and Its Search for a New Home

- 1976 – Senior Center first opened at the Visitor’s Center
- 1978 – Senior Center moved to two rooms at the Church of Our Redeemer
- 1985 – Senior Center moved to Muzzey Condominiums (intended as a temporary location)
- 1998-2000 – First attempts to establish a new, and more permanent, location for the Senior Center
- 2000 – Town Meeting approved the amount of “\$50,000 for site analysis and schematic drawings” for a new Senior Center
- 2000 – Senior Center Siting Committee established
- 2001 – COA Siting Committee established
- 2002 – Board of Selectmen approved investigation of North Street site, but reaffirmed their preference for the Bedford Street site
- 2003 – Re-evaluation Advisory Committee established
- 2005 – Senior Center Action Plan Committee established
- 2006 – SCAPC released its report
- 2007 – Town Meeting approved a feasibility study to evaluate the use of the ‘White House’ site for a Senior Center and to examine whether senior services could be accommodated at the ‘White House’ site and at the existing Muzzey site
- 2008 – Report on the findings of the feasibility study issued by Bargmann Hendrie + Archetype
- 2009 – Board of Selectmen delay decision on use of ‘White House’ site
