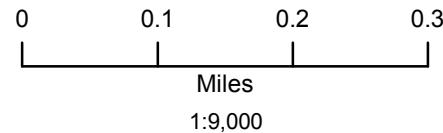


# Lexington Conservation Lands

## Meagherville

52 acres, 2 miles of trail. Meagherville consists largely of pine-beech forest, including the largest stand of American beech remaining in town. The northern end of Meagherville consists mostly of wetlands. A beautiful stretch of stream (a branch of Kiln Brook) winds through the area. Geologically, the Meagherville area belongs with the Tophet Swamp area, but the two have been separated by Route 128.

Access is from the end of Garfield Street; the main trail enters behind the playground at Garfield Park. Access is also from Ward Street and Cedar Street, just before the entry to Pine Meadows Golf Course.
