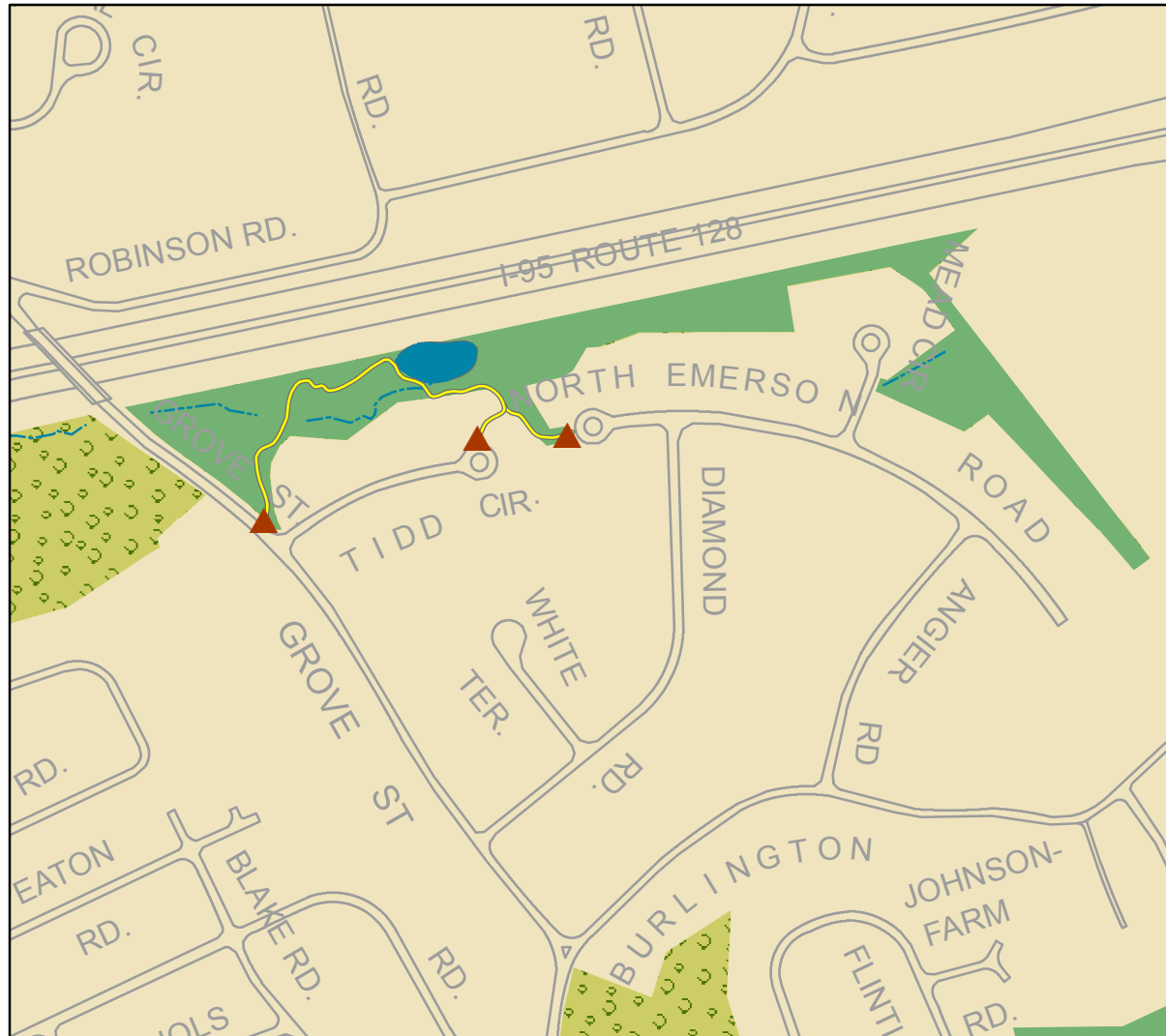

Turning Mill Pond

10 acres, 0.25 miles of trails. Turning Mill Pond is located alongside Route 128 and offers a small glimpse at part of a 300-year-old homestead. The human-made pond here was used to power a turning mill during the early 1800s, and later, ice was cut from it by a local ice company. Today, the pond makes for good ice skating when the ice is thick and smooth enough.

Access is from Grove Street, via a right of way at Tidd Circle, or from the circle at the end of North Emerson Road.
